

## Collusion or Collision—Part 2 Obeying God vs. Caesar From Sermon 4.18.21

Read Mark 12:14-17

Review from Sunday's sermon: <u>It is God who establishes authority. Because of man's sin nature, God instituted various restraints and ordained consequences for sin. Part of the coming collision in each person's future will be a choice between rebelling against God's authority or that of the government. This is a complex, yet important line to walk and consequences to consider.</u>

1. The world has made authority the enemy. Why does man rebel against each authority? <u>His sin nature.</u> <u>He follows his father, the devil, who was the first and ultimate rebel against authority. Man also wants to be/be like God.</u>

2. The problem is not the design, but the failure of the 1) human authority and 2) those subject to him. Discuss. <u>Because leaders of every sphere are fallen, sinful human agents, they abuse power, gain power through selfish means, and serve self. All followers are fallen and sinful and naturally rebel.</u>

What is our obligation to civil (any) authority? <u>We are to respect, obey, and pray for them.</u>
What if I view them as corrupt or inept? <u>I'm still obligated to obey and respect</u>.
What if they are not of my political party or if I disagree with a law or policy? <u>All those are irrelevant to obedience and submission to God-ordained authority.</u> See *Matthew 23:3*

4. On Sunday, it was stated: The problem also lies in one sphere invading or colluding with another. Give some historic examples. <u>The collusion of the Church and State in the Dark Ages. Many modern examples</u>

5. What are some of the "sphere invasions" of our day? <u>The Government dictating and defining</u> <u>home/family = overriding parental authority. Government dictating church meetings and conduct.</u>

6. When does the Christian have the permission/obligation to defy civil authority [or any authority]? <u>When it clearly violates the Law, Nature, or Commands of God.</u> See also *Acts 4:18-20 & 5:27-29* 

7. Back to Collusion or Collision. What are/will be the consequences of <u>our</u> church following civil rulings when they defy the commands of God in Scripture? On the other hand, what are/will be the consequences of our church following the commands of God in Scripture even when they defy the rulings of the civil authority? See also *Matthew 10:16-22* <u>Various personal observations and conclusions</u>.
