

John: The Great "I AM" Gospel John 15:12-17 From Sermon 1.12.25

Read John 15:12-17

Overview from Sunday's sermon: <u>If you use the inaccurate, historic English Bible translations, there is almost no controversy in these continuing loving, equipping words of Christ. However, the accurate translation causes a firestorm. As with every Bible truth, once you alter the wording you inevitably alter the doctrine, and it snowballs from there. [JW example] This is the case of the modern church. This special lesson focuses mostly on that alteration since it's critical to the remainder of Jesus' teaching.</u>

- 1. In just a casual scan of the text, what topics does Jesus touch on in this section? <u>Commandment. Love.</u> <u>Degree of love. Friendship with Christ. New identity. Sovereign election. Fruit-bearing. Answered prayer.</u>
- 1a. Although all great and valid topics, what did we camp on in Sunday's sermon? The Master/slave relationship reality.
- 2. What emotions and reactions do you have when you hear the term "slave". <u>Various personal answers.</u> <u>Overwhelmingly negative, based on the horrific/evil slave trade for hundreds of years.</u>
- 2a. But to be culturally sensitive (and now politically correct), what did the translators of the English Bible do? Altered the Scripture to avoid the very word/term Jesus used...Scripture uses.
 - Greek Word: <u>Doulos = slave</u> = ownership
 - Used <u>150 times</u> in the New Testament in some form.
 - "Servant" = Diakonos =deacon = hired
- 3. With this word change accepted (even celebrated in some circles), what false doctrine has also arisen? That God/Christ somehow serves us. He is bound by my will and desires, not the other way around. This false doctrine undermines the sovereignty of God. Also, the entire "manifest" movement.
- 4. What controversial truths are concluded when we remain faithful to the "slave" doctrine? Everyone is slave...a slave to something. See *Romans 6:16 & 2 Peter 2:19* (use Legacy Standard Version). Everyone has one of two possible Masters:
 - Christ Jesus/Yahweh. See also Joshua 5:13-15 & 2 Peter 1:1
 - Sin (Devil). See *John 8:34 & 44*
- 5. If the Bible clearly teaches that Christians are slaves (1 Corinthians 6:19-20), how can it also teach we are free? We have been freed from the bondage of sin—the curse—the requirements of the Law. See Romans 8:1-2
- 6. Is it okay (orthodox) to view Jesus as a friend? <u>Yes. Of course. Even He stated that. But not only a friend & not merely a buddy or partner.</u> It is the slave-friend relationship. Same as with brother, child, & sheep.
